DESIGN FOR A FONT OF PRINTING-TYPE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 18,156, dated March 6, 1888.

Application filed December 24, 18c7. Serial No. 258,930. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES E. HEYER, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, Cook county, Illinois, have invented and 5 produced a new and original Design for a Font of Printing Type, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying typographic impressions, which are exact representations of said design.

The character of this design is a moderately heavy somewhat condensed type without ornamentation, and comprises capitals, dollarmark, (\$,) figures, and points.

The marked peoplicity of this design is

The marked peculiarity of this design is shown in letters having at one end, either top or bottom, two ceriphs which are unequally and dissimilarly oblique to their stems—e. g., A, K, M, N, R, U, V, W, X, and Y—giving to the top or bottom line of the letters an irregu-

lar broken appearance. Minor peculiarities 20 are the abrupt upward turning of the upper line of the E, F, and Z, the downwardly-oblique cross line of the A and the H, the slightly curved downward stroke of the K, and the cross-line of the Q, which is downward to 25 the left, slightly upward, and then a horizontal swell.

I claim-

The design for a font of printing -types The design for a font of printing types herein shown and described, having letters, as 3c A, K, M, N, R, U, V, W, X, and Y, which have at one end, either top or bottom, two ceripbs unequally and dissimilarly oblique to their stems, substantially as illustrated.
