ALPHABET AND FIGURE STENCILS

We are listing a few attractive stencils, alphabet with figures (numbering from one to ten) and suggest that beginners order a few of these, as they will be of great help in obtaining these beautiful effects from the very start. They will also be of help to you in making your own stencils after you get started. By placing the stencil onto the work with small thumb tacks, rubber cement or lead weights, and air brushing along the stencil edges, these effects are very easily obtained. If rounded, embossed or raised effects are wanted, air brush along the edges that you want the shadow to appear after stencil has been removed, and you will obtain the round embossed effect, as shown in some of these illustrations. Stencils are one of the greatest aids in connection with the use of the air brush, and a few of these will pay for themselves time and over again.
