DESIGN FOR A FONT OF PRINTING-TYPE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 22,437, dated May 16, 1893.

Application filed March 14, 1893. Serial No. 465,975. Term of patent 31/2 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM WALLACE JACKSON, a citizen of the United States, residing at Philadelphia, in the county of Philastelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a certain new, useful, and original Design for a Font of Printing-Types, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description.

This design relates to a font of printing types, and consists essentially in heavy faced type combining elements closely akin to the ancient cuneiform characters and a sort of back-handed shading in the curved lines.

In the accompanying drawing forming part hereof, I have shown a lower and an upper case alphabet and also a line of numerals and other characters usually comprised in a font of type. As shown, for example, in the stem

of the lower case "a," there is a combination of coneiform characters and in the curve of that letter is the back-handed shading. The upper case "A" shows very distinctly the cuneiform characteristics, while both the upper and the lower case "C" show a union of the 25 cuneiform and back-handed shading. All of the characters are heavy-faced, and exhibit, in greater or less degree, this and the other essential features of my design.

What I claim is—

The design for a font of printing types, substantially as shown and described.
