DESIGN FOR FONT OF PRINTING-TYPES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,669**, dated May 7, 1878; application filed April 12, 1878.
[Term of patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM W. JACKSON, (assignor to MACKELLAR, SMITHS & JORDAN,) of the city and county of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new Design for a Font of Printing-Type, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is clearly shown in the accompanying typographic impression, to which reference is had; and consists of an old-style condensed letter, shaded on the right and bottom by a series of short horizontal lines.

The letters A, E, F, and H are ornamented by the cross-line, one end of which is made broader than the opposite end, the broader portion being made almost triangular in shape

or appearance. The upper portion of the letter K and the tail of the letter Q are similarly formed.

The design is preserved in the figures and lower-case, and the upper portion of the g, upon the right-hand, and the tail of the y, are formed of a line broader at one end than the other.

Having now set forth my design, what I claim as new is—

The design for a font of printing-type, as shown and described.
